

UNCOMMON CASE OF HEMOPTYSIS IN CHILD

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- - I don 't have conflicts of interest -
- A 2 years old patient, previously healthy, with diagnosis of pneumonie, cause of hemoptysis.
- Discarding TBC and other regional illnes, videofibronchoscopy shows ingurgitation, and remodeling pulmonary venules in main bronchus.
- AngioCT with vascular reconstruction: Stenosis left pulmonary veins.
- Confirmed with Pulmonary Biopsy: Pulmonary Capillary Hemangiomatosis.
- Being an ordinary 8 years old, no persistence of hemoptisis, no worsening of pulmonary hipertensión, with only yearly check ups, makes this report the only one of its kind so far.
- Hemoptysis, an infrequent and severe symptom in childhood.
- **Videobronchoscopy** in nonbleeding period, is an invaluable rate of diagnosis of pathology, and in this case, an important tool to aim at Veno Occlusive Disease.
